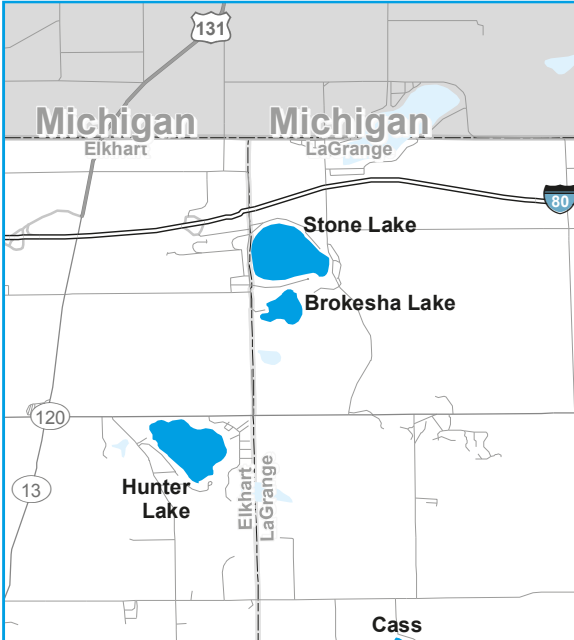

**FISH STOCKING DATA: No Record of Stocking**

**Notes:** Stone Lake is considered a good fishing lake, featuring bass, catfish, crappies and some nice bluegills. Brokesha is a 36-acre lake connected by a channel to the southern end of Stone. It has a similar fishery to Stone Lake and offers good ice fishing.

Bass anglers can try their luck fishing weed flats on the north side of Stone with soft plastics like Senkos or Trick worms. Fish deeper drop-offs on the east and west shoreline with Carolina-rigged soft plastics, jig-n-pigs or deep-diving crankbaits. If you're there early or late in the day during summer months, use a buzzbait over weeds or along any shoreline cover to draw a strike from an active bass. Don't forget to try a whole nightcrawler hooked once through the nose with no added weight. This rig isn't weedless, but it sure can get the attention of some big bass in small waters.

Target catfish along the same areas using nightcrawlers or stinkbait.

Panfish can be caught anywhere along weed edges or other submerged cover using a variety of bait and lures. Some productive offerings include redworms, pieces of nightcrawler, Road Runners or Beetle Spins.

Safety is a concern at the public access. The site is at the bottom of a hill, just off a county road. Vehicles with larger boats cannot get off the road when launching, and parking is inadequate.
